CITY OF CANAL FULTON CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES February 17, 2015

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Richard Harbaugh called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

ROLL CALL

Mayor/Council Members Present: Richard Harbaugh, James Deans, Scott Svab, Sean Craney, Danny Losch, Sue Mayberry and Nellie Cihon

SWEARING IN - Scott Borojevich -- FIRE DEPT

Mayor Richard Harbaugh swore in Scott Borojecvich to the Fire Department.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Scott Svab reported that the Finance Committee met prior to the meeting. Finance Director William Rouse reported on the 2014 year-end summary. The threshold on purchase orders that have to go before council was discussed. The Law Director was asked to prepare legislation to change the threshold from \$3,000.00 to \$5,000.00.

CITIZENS' COMMENTS - AGENDA MATTERS (Five Minutes per Individual - No Yield)

Linda Zahirsky - 413 S. Milan

Mrs. Zahirsky said she would like Council to consider not passing Ordinance 4:15 and move forward with Ordinance 5:15. Mrs. Zahirsky said most people she has talked too agreed and were shocked that the reduction in fees for gaming could be cut in half. She would like the fees to stay the same with quarterly payments.

Peter Sundlin - 6525 Wales

Mr. Sundlin stated that our fees for garning facilities are extremely high in comparison to Jackson. Mr. Sundlin said it is tough to start the business with the high fees. Mr. Sundlin would like consideration for fees that are more in line with surrounding areas.

CORRECTING & ADOPTING THE RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

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A motion was made to approve the February 3, 2015 meeting minutes by Sue Mayberry, second by Nellie Cihon.

Mrs. Mayberry asked that the word "not" be added to page 1 in Chief Swartz' report, and also clarification made on page 4 in regards to the statement "Mrs. Mayberry said that she would feel better." Mrs. Mayberry asked that it be changed to reflect that she would feel better if historical things would be kept from the old school house.

All Council Members voted yes. Motion approved.

REPORTS OF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS

Senior Citizens - No Report

Community Service - A report was distributed at the meeting.

Fire Chief – A report was distributed at the meeting. Chief Ray Durkee reported that the purchase orders in the packet included one to Physio Control for a defibrillator that will complement the other squad. The department did receive a grant for \$24,000 to help with the cost. Purchase Order 245 is for squad 8 repairs.

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Police Chief – A report was distributed at the meeting. Chief Doug Swartz reported that Officer John Barabasch was attending a course for two-day background checks. Chief Swartz said that he is the right person to take the course.

Chief Swartz stated that he would like a voice motion from Council to remove Canal Fulton Police Department Chad Himes.

A motion was made to adhere to the advice of Police Chief Doug Swartz and remove Chad Himes from the Canal Fulton Police Department for non-compliance of probationary period by Sue Mayberry, second by Nellie Cihon. All Council Members voted yes. Motion approved.

Engineer/Streets/Public Utilities – Engineer Bill Dorman reported that they are working on Storm Water prevention Plans required by the Ohio EPA. The Engineer is assisting administration on the Cherry/Locust Street Project and the Locust Water/Sewer Assessment projects. Mr. Dorman stated that the Planning Commission will have one item before it on the Sandy Ridge Development.

Street Superintendent Mark Petersen thanked Council for the quick response on ordering a new dump truck. He also thanked the Finance Director for his part in the process also. The truck is set for delivery in September and will one to two months to implement the body.

Mr. Petersen stated that Chip and Seal with white limestone does not work as well with salt application. The department has to use more salt. Mr. Petersen invited Council to visit Rupp to take a look at materials that can be used that will be better in the winter for the next Chip and Seal project. Mr. Petersen that he would like to look into a process called micro-sealing with the road in front of the high school. The County would be the frontrunner of the project. Microsealing looks like black top. They would chip and seal the road first and then micro-seal the following year. Mr. Petersen said he is hoping to get numbers for chip and seal next week.

Mayor Harbaugh stated that in a recent snowstorm Canal Fulton roads were good. The State and Township roads were a disaster. Mayor Harbaugh thanked Mr. Petersen for the good work

Finance Director – January Financials were included in the packet. Finance Director William Rouse thanked Council for moving forward with the dump truck. The truck has been ordered.

Mr. Rouse stated that the financials included for one month were hard to sense a trend. Income tax was down 13%. Mr. Rouse said this could be due to timing issues, such as the way the end of the month fell and withholding payments coming in. The same applies to utility payments also.

Mr. Rouse stated that he is working through the financing for the Cherry/Locust project, including grants and contracts. He would like Council to consider a Finance Committee meeting to review overall finances for the project.

Mrs. Mayberry stated that neither of the contracts for Resolution 4:15 and 5:15 have the certified to form stamp by the Law Director as per our charter. She stated we must ensure that this is on the contracts.

A motion was made to have a Finance Committee meeting March 3, 2015 at 6:30pm to discuss the Cherry/Locust Project by Scott Svab, second by Sue Mayberry. All Council Members voted yes. Motion approved.

City Manager — City Manager Mark Cozy stated that they did pass legislation last year authorizing a bond counsel for the project. Mr. Cozy said that it was decided to wait to see what the approach was on the project. He asked the Law Director if the legislation is still valid. Mr. Fellmeth stated it was. Mr. Rouse said he would like to talk to Council about it at the Committee. He said to him the approach was that when he came on board, the former Finance Director had start on one path and he had to pick up in the middle. He would like a better understanding of the project and wanted to see if we were going to receive the grant from OPWC. We did get the grant and it will go a long way if we have to go out for debt to minimize how much. The more that Mr. Rouse understands with the contracts, he thought that the options needed looked at and they would go from there. Mr. Rouse stated he wanted to go to committee first and get their thoughts.

Mr. Cozy stated that Resolution 4:15 and 5:15 need passed tonight. Before they are signed Mr. Cozy stated that he would have Law Director Fellmeth stamp them that they are approved to form.

Mr. Cozy stated that with Resolution 3:15 they had talked about passing that tonight. It is for Water/Sewer on Locust. There is a partner legislation being drafted by the Law Director for

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the street widening portion. He would like to wait until the next meeting to pass both pieces together. These would involve a petition process and the legislation allows us to assess those on Locust Street.

Mr. Cozy said that he had copies of a preliminary report of the Hotel Feasibility Study. He asked that Council review and comment back on any errors in the report.

Sue Mayberry stated that Mr. Cozy initially reported that the Heritage Society was not required to sign the Canal Lands II Annexation petition as their land was not in it. Now she is hearing it is. Why the change, and does this affect the legality of the approved legislation?

Mr. Cozy stated that the Heritage Society expressed an interest to be part of the annexation. They voted last week to be a part of the petition. Yes, we will need to update our legislation. Mr. Cozy stated he is waiting for a new plat is completed. It makes sense, when you look at the aerial maps, most of Lock IV Park is owned by the Heritage Society. Mr. Cozy stated that if there was an issue there, who gets called? Mr. Cozy asked the Heritage Society who they wanted to show up if there is a problem, and they stated the City.

Mr. Fellmeth said the legislation will have to be redone. Specifically what needs done is a new legal description. The Heritage Society would have to join in a petition for the annexation so there would be new legislation required.

Mr. Losch asked if it would be amended or a whole new annexation. Mr. Felimeth said it would actually be an amended petition to bring them in. The Canal Lands II Annexation that was passed including the 66 acres, now we are talking about an increased property. It would probably be a lot less cost affective if we stopped where we are right now, and went back and did it a single petition for annexation including the Heritage Society, plus what we have already agreed to, rather than do separate legislation on it.

Mayor - No Report

Parks & Recreation Board – Earl Minks reported that the Daddy Daughter Dance went well with about 200 attendants. He thanked the volunteers that helped. The Easter Egg Hunt is on March 28, 2015. The department is looking for volunteer for that day. The Board approved a chair of honor by the Flag in Mulhauser Park by Sam Wilson.

Law Director - Law Director Scott Fellmeth stated that only Ordinance 4:15 or 5:15 could be approved. Not both. Ordinance 4:15 reduces the fees and 5:15 allows for quarterly payments.

Sue Mayberry asked about Ordinance 5:15. Where the rates stay the same, what ensures payment to fulfill obligation? Sue asked if they move out after the first quarter, then they are done. Mr. Fellmeth stated that was correct.

THIRD READINGS

Resolution 1:15: A Resolution by the Council of the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio to Enter into an Agreement with CTI Engineers, Inc. to Provide Professional Engineering Services for the Years 2015 and 2016 for the City of Canal Fulton Engineer.

A motion was made to approve Resolution 1:15 by Nellie Cihon, second by Danny Losch. All Council Members voted yes. Motion approved.

Ordinance 3-15: An Ordinance by the Council of the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio Authorizing the Canal Lands III Annexation of 120.987 Acres, more or less, from Lawrence Township, Stark County, Ohio to the City of Canal Fulton

A motion was made to approve Ordinance 3:15 by Sean Craney, second by Nellie Cihon.

Mrs. Mayberry stated that this Canal Lands III thing was a pretty big deal. Back in October, when Mr. Craney requested moving ahead on this annexation, specifically, Canal Lands II, I had no idea Canal Lands III was already in motion as well.

Since then, she has asked what the City's intentions and plans are if these annexations go through, and it was basically for the city and future growth.

Other reasons given were so the City could better market itself as the largest canal in the state, and to create marketing power to create possibilities for our park development. Mrs. Mayberry stated that Mr. Losch added with Canal Lands III we could put sewers to Clinton in Summit County but wasn't sure what it would mean to take that on.

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Mrs. Mayberry stated that she would like to know when was Canal Lands III actually created, because when she first heard it, she did not even know it existed.

Mr. Cozy stated that the plat was done in 2008. Mayor Grogan had it done. It sat on a shelf,

Mrs. Mayberry asked if Mr. Cozy had discussed it with Mayor Harbaugh, Canal Lands III, in any shape or form.

Mr. Cozy stated not that he recalled. Council brought it up and it is on the agenda. Mrs. Mayberry questioned if Mayor Harbaugh was not talked to about it. Mrs. Mayberry said no.

Mr. Losch said this has always been available.

Mrs. Mayberry said well, you know, you think that the Mayor would know about it.

Mr. Cozy said he did not advance or promote the annexation. He was asked by Council what we had and it was taken to a committee meeting after that. He said he was not sure what he was supposed to do. Council lead up the charge on the issue.

Mrs. Mayberry asked if the City had received Stark Parks' commitment to continue maintain this area in writing, which was asked of Mr. Cozy to get.

Mr. Cozy stated that they were not going to give us anything in writing. They are going to take care of what they always take care of. Mrs. Mayberry said you were asked to and you agreed to do it. Mr. Cozy said he attempted to and talked with Bob Fonte. As far as Canal Lands III goes, the majority is owned by the City, it is our responsibility in that particular plat.

Mrs. Mayberry stated that was all she had.

The vote is as follows: Danny Losch – yes; Jim Deans – yes; Scott Svab – yes; Sue Mayberry – No; Nellie Cihon – yes; Sean Craney – yes. Motion approved.

Ordinance 4-15: An Ordinance by the Council of the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio to Amend Title Seven of the Planning and Zoning Code of the Codified Ordinances of Canal Fulton, Ohio to Amend Chapter 188.07 – Amusement Arcades and Repealing any Ordinance Conflict Therewith.

A motion was made to pass Ordinance 4-15 by Scott Svab, second by Sean Craney.

Danny Losch stated he had looked at this and he sent an email out questioning if the individual under this ordinance had to pay up front for the fees, for the year, under this ordinance, his concern was if the individual did not survive the year, then would Council or the City be liable to reimburse him the amount based on the time he was here.

Mr. Fellmeth stated no, that only one section would be amended of the chapter. The fees are non-refundable.

Mr. Svab said he knew this was a hot topic issue. Reducing the fees or even having gaming here. Mr. Svab said we had a gaming establishment here; they paid twenty something thousand they were here. The Police Chief said he never had any call or problems with associated gambling or gaming. This is a legal business. If you look at \$50.00 per month, that is \$600.00 a year. If he does 30 machines in there, that is \$18,000, plus the license and location fee. We are talking \$20,000 annually that goes into our general fund. Annually that is equal to our tax rate over a million dollars in payroll. We would need a business in Canal Fulton to have a million dollar payroll, which would mean twenty employees at \$50,000 a year to generate that kind of income. So, whether you like gaming or not, if an employer came here and said they had a business that was going to generate a million dollars in payroll taxes, he thought everyone would throw a party. Unfortunately because there are some people that have issues with gaming even though they play Bingo, play everything else under the sun, they don't want the establishment in this vicinity. We have a tracking history that we did not have any crime problems with it, but yet people will be residents here and drive elsewhere and play, so he is voting yes for this. Mr. Svab said he does not frequent those establishments, but he does not have a problem with them either. He encouraged Council to vote yes.

Mayor Harbaugh stated in other words he did not want to see the money go to Jackson, he would like it to stay here. Mr. Svab said he would like it to stay here.

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Mr. Svab said he did not like to see vacant buildings in our city and this would help to keep up the vacant buildings and help the owners with their taxes.

Mr. Craney stated that he wanted to add that this was brought to Council and it was recommended to be brought to Economic Development and was debated on. Mr. Craney stated that just because it may not be your cup of tea, it is a legal business. It was asked to lower the rates. We are trying to keep in line with what other cities are doing around us.

Mr. Sundlin said that quarterly payments were better.

Mr. Svab said this does not allow quarterly payments. Mr. Sundlin stated that he was looking for quarterly payments, they were more reasonable.

Mr. Craney said he had an issue with 5:15. It was not debated upon or talked about what so ever among the Committee or Council, it just appeared as legislation. Ordinance 4:15 was what was discussed and voted on. Ordinance 5:15 appeared the next meeting as another option. Mr. Craney said he was not sure where 5:15 came from. Mr. Losch and Mrs. Mayberry said Mr. Fellmeth explained the legislation. Mr. Craney asked who authorized the legislation to be put on the agenda.

Mr. Fellmeth stated he did the Ordinance. Mr. Fellmeth said he discussed it with the City Manager. He thought that the rate we were charging was comparable to Massillon. He said if we lower the up-front costs to establish a gaming business, that it might be more attractive. The final analysis does not matter where it came from. Council asked and I thought at least I could present an alternative.

Mr. Craney asked who can put legislation on. Mrs. Mayberry said anybody. Mr. Losch said he did support Mr. Fellmeth on this. He felt if a business was going to come here and start up, it would alleviate the up-front cost for an annual payment. He said he talked to Mr. Fellmeth about it. Mr. Losch said he had to ask the gentleman what he was more comfortable with, quarterly.

Mr. Sundlin said quarterly was more affordable and up front. Any business might take off or fail after the first six months. He would like to be there forever, but you never know. Machines can be resold. The cost here will never be recouped. Quarterly payments is what he feels is fair.

Mr. Craney said he wished Mr. Sundlin would have been here when they had the meeting, it was indicated to the committee that they were looking for reduction. The quarterly would not matter.

Mr. Sundlin said it would be nice to have a reduction in the fees.

Mr. Craney stated it was never put to the committee that quarterly would be acceptable. It is fine that the legislation came out; Mr. Craney had an issue with it just popping out.

Mr. Craney again said he wished Mr. Sundlin would have been at the Economic Development Committee meeting. Mr. Craney said he was trying to support him being here.

Mr. Losch stated that this Council was trying to create the possibility for this type of business to be here, and at the same time stay in line with the surround region. Mr. Losch said he thought that this Council really did a good job to create the possibility for Mr. Sundlin to be here. Mr. Losch said he would like to support Ordinance 5:15.

Mr. Svab asked Mr. Sundlin if he was happy with Ordinance 5:15. Mr. Sundlin said yes the quarterly. Coming up with a full year is tough for anybody.

Nellie Cihon asked just to be clear, 4:15 that you pay for the full year up front and 5:15 you pay quarterly.

Mr. Svab asked again if Mr. Sundlin would prefer 5:15 at a higher rate. Mr. Sundlin said he was confused. Mr. Losch stated it was the same rate as the existing ordinance.

Mr. Fellmeth said a recommendation was made to reduce the fees. We went back and investigated to see what other areas were charging. Mr. Cozy stated Massillon got back to us the very next day.

Mr. Craney said that was fine, if they wanted Ordinance 5:15. He wants to support business.

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Roll call was as follows: Scott Svab - No; Nellie Cihon - No; Danny Losch - No; Sue Mayberry - No; Jim Deans - No; Sean Craney - No. Motion fails.

Sean Craney stated that he welcomes any businesses that want to come to Canal Fulton. He believes it is their job as Council Members to try and help and foster economic growth in town. Whether you agree with the establishment or not, they are legitimate business. He encouraged businesses to come to the meetings. We need business input if we are going to try and help.

Sue Mayberry stated that she regularly reviews our Charter and Council Rules and Regulations. She has made some observations and need to bring to everyone's attention. The office of Mayor serves as President of Council and Presiding Officer.

In future newsletters and water bills, the President Pro Tem wants to put in an article, it should report as Council President Pro Tem. It has been used several times and it is not correct.

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Also, under Rule 16, Communications and Correspondence, it states, all appropriately signed correspondence addressed to Canal Fulton City Council (or similarity thereof) shall be read aloud at any Council meeting by the Clerk of Council, unless the communication contains charges of a personal nature.

At the last meeting, Mr. Losch, Svab and Cozy acknowledged the existence of a letter the township sent to the city. It was addressed to Scott Svab and Council Members requesting a joint meeting with the city. Where is my copy, I never got a copy? Did anyone else on council get theirs? Danny Losch stated that he did. Mr. Losch said Mr. Svab gave it to him on the first meeting of the year of Council. Mr. Losch stated he failed to bring it to Council's attention, and he accepts responsibility for not letting Council be aware of that.

Mrs. Mayberry stated that Mr. Svab never gave anybody else a copy of the letter and it was addressed to her, and she did not get one. That is not a good thing.

Mr. Losch said he did not get a copy either, he received Mr. Svab' copy.

Not receiving this correspondence is not acceptable and steps should be put in place to not allow this to happen in the future.

Mr. Svab asked what the date was when he received the letter. Mrs. Dolan stated it was January 6.

Mrs. Mayberry said they also said they sent one in November. Mr. Svab said he was not aware of that. Mr. Cozy stated we had no record of that.

Mrs. Mayberry said all she knew was January 1 through the last meeting; she should have had a copy of the letter by this City.

Mr. Cozy stated the envelope said - to Council President Scott Svab, to be read at the Council Meeting. It did not say any other Council Member on it. Mrs. Mayberry said she got a copy of the envelope, it said Scott Svab and Council Members. She has a copy of the envelope.

Mrs. Mayberry stated she wanted to point that out that this cannot happen.

Mrs. Dolan stated she asked for a copy of the envelope and did not receive a copy of the envelope.

The city water bill has become a political tool.

Mrs. Mayberry stated, yes, I voted "NO" to purchase the elementary school at a sheriff's sale. I heard for the very first time at a special meeting the city's intention to buy the school and tear it down which could cost up to \$200K or more. Mr. Cozy also has stated we probably won't recoup this expense if we choose to sell the property.

At that meeting, our law director advised us to wait and see what happens at the sale - we didn't need to rush.

We met on the 29th of December and the Sheriff Sale was on the 6th of January. Mrs. Mayberry stated that she did not have your same urgency to vote in favor of something where we didn't know what it will cost the taxpayers in the long run, but yet you singled her out on a water bill.

Mr. Svab stated it is not a water bill, it is a mini newsletter. Mrs. Mayberry stated it was a mini political newsletter. Mr. Svab said you are able to submit anything as well as any Council Member.

Mrs. Mayberry said yes, but it is not to make someone look bad, or try too. Mr. Svab said he was not making her look bad.

Mr. Svab said did you not vote no. Mrs. Mayberry said yes, but are you going to put everything else in there that I voted no on tonight too. Mr. Svab said she could right anything she wanted to as well.

Mr. Losch asked if we could move on. Mrs. Mayberry said yes, move on please.

Mrs. Dolan stated that maybe the City could include that as part of the records retention.

Mrs. Zahirsky stated that there was not a vote on Scott Borojevich to hire him for the Fire Department. A vote was not taken for the acceptance of the Finance Director's financial reports for January.

A motion was made to hire Scott Borojevich to the Fire Department by Sue Mayberry, second by Scott Svab. All Council Members voted yes. Motion approved.

A motion was made to accept the January Financial Reports by Danny Losch, second by Scott Svab. All Council Members voted yes. Motion approved.
